TRIP FORMATS: "Specify when making your reservation"

1. **Inflatable Kayaks (IK's) and Rafts** - Our standard overnight trip. Two person inflatable kayaks require no previous experience to enjoy and are the format of choice with our guests and guides. Our most popular trip for families and individual groups! We bring our gear boat for all the comfort items and paddle rafts for the less adventurous.

Cost: \$350 p/p - Minimum Five Persons.

2. **Kayak Lesson** - ACA certified instruction. Intermediate level kayak class! Guaranteed to improve your skills! Break through to the play side of kayaking.

Cost: \$350 per person - Minimum Four Students. (Call for ability level requirements)

3. **Private Group - Raft Support** - For private boaters desiring a catered trip so you can enjoy paddling without dealing with logistics, cooking, cleaning, shuttle, etc. This product includes all the amenities of our commercial overnight, excluding personal water craft, equipment, and guide. **Cost: \$100 p/p** - Minimum Six Persons.

DAY 1: Meet at designated location near Minden Nevada at 9:00 am. Meeting location and directions are provided with your reservation confirmation. We offer free round trip transportation for groups of ten or more, departing Reno at 8:00 AM. Prior to departure, we make a thorough check of each person's personal gear, packing your belongings into dry bags for the trip. Your trip begins with a safety talk and equipment introduction at the put in. Depart downstream at approximately 10:30 AM. Depending on your trip format, the trip pace is set. Lunch is served on the river. After lunch we continue down stream to our camp spot. At approximately 3:30 PM we break for camp. After settling in, a short hike to the hot springs will ensue. Dinner is served at approximately 6:00 PM. The evening is yours to relax and enjoy...

DAY 2: Breakfast is served at 9:00 AM. After packing camp, we depart downstream at approximately 10:30 AM. The rapids are gentler on the second day and our river pace is dictated by your trip format. A side canyon hike may occur. Lunch is served on the river. Our average distance per day is approximately 10 miles. We arrive at the takeout at approximately 3:30 PM and transport you back to your vehicles and/or depart to Reno at about 4:30PM.

WHAT WE PROVIDE:

We provide two days whitewater adventure. Camping on the river. Professional guides and instructors. All river equipment including inflatable kayaks (IK's), rafts, paddles, PFD's, helmet, 4mm wet suit, splash jacket, safety equipment, dry bags for personal gear, and tents. Meal service: 1-continental breakfast, 2-lunches, 1-five course dinner, 1-full breakfast. Transportation to and from the river. Free round trip transportation for groups of ten or more.

WHAT YOU NEED TO BRING:

River Clothing: 1-pair (top and bottom) synthetic long underwear, 1-long sleeve fleece sweater. 1-pair appropriate river shoes - Soled neoprene booties are best for warmth (old sneakers, water shoes and river sandals work well too), 1-pair neoprene, wool or fleece socks. **Do not bring “cotton” long underwear for the river.** You need to bring your own sleeping bag and ground pad.

Personal Items: Hygiene and medication. **Clothing:** 1-rain jacket, 1-sweater, 2-long pants, 1-shorts, 2-long sleeve shirts, 1-pair long underwear, 1-pair sandals, 1-pair light hiking boots, 2-pair hiking socks, bathing suit, baseball cap, sunglasses with retention device, sun screen, insect repellent, spending money for additional items, shopping and emergencies. This is all you need for personal items, were only out for two nights. Plan ahead for personal hygiene, medical and other important considerations prior to embarking on this trip. We travel to remote areas, often inaccessible but for emergency evacuation situations. Please come prepared.
